What We're Learning!

Math: In math this week we will focus on more place value standards:

"I can round numbers to the nearest digit up to 10,000."

"I can determine elapsed time to the minute."

Reading: We will begin our study of fables, fairy tales, folktales, and myths this week. We will explore stories from each of these genres and work on retelling the details. We will use the key details to describe the central message of each story.

"I can recount a variety of stories and determine the central message, lesson or moral through key details."

Social Studies (Mrs. Clark): Students will learn that **history** is the study of the past, that **ancient** means very old, and that a **civilization** is a group of people living and working together in a well organized way. We will learn about the civilizations of Ancient Egypt, Ancient Rome, and Ancient China. We will study history to see that people who lived long ago were like us in many ways, and different from us in other ways.
